
## Coretha Rushing, SHRM-SCP

A sought-after corporate executive, Rushing has served on a variety of Boards. She is currently a Board Member for 2U, a public educational technology company, and serves on its Compensation and Organization Committee. She has been an active member of the Society for Human Resource Management (SHRM) since 1998 and a member of its national Board of Directors since 2012. She served as SHRM Board Chair from 2017 to 2018 during a period of growth, transition, and transformation for the organization and HR profession.

Rushing regularly speaks on the most critical business and HR topics today, such as the Changing Workforce and Workplace, Leadership Transition, Women in Leadership, and Diversity and Inclusion.
